# Writing an Academic Paragraph or Essay

#### **Get Ideas**

- -- Brainstorm; do free writing or clustering; ask and answer "wh" questions.
- -- Group your ideas and narrow the topic.

### Write a Draft of Your Topic Sentence (or Thesis Statement in an Essay)

- -- Have a clear central idea.
- -- Narrow the topic with a controlling idea.

#### **Create an Outline**

- -- Do you have all your ideas in the outline? Could you add more?
- -- Do all the ideas support your topic sentence (or thesis statement)?
- -- Do you provide enough support?
- -- Is the order of supporting ideas logical?

## Write the 1<sup>st</sup> Draft

- -- Keep your topic sentence or thesis firmly in mind and follow your outline.
- -- Let the words and ideas flow -- don't worry about grammar, sentence structure, and variety of sentences.

#### **Check the First Draft**

- -- Do you support your topic sentence or thesis statement clearly and directly?
- -- Do you provide enough support?
- -- If you are writing an essay, does each topic sentence of each paragraph echo the thesis?
- -- Is your essay coherent, unified, and cohesive?
- -- Do you need to add anything or delete anything?
- -- Is your final sentence in a paragraph an appropriate finish? Are your concluding remarks in an essay appropriate and effective?
- -- **Now** edit for sentence structure and sentence variety, grammar, word choice, spelling check for the grammar or writing points you are working on to improve.

#### Write the Final Draft

-- Do a final check for "typos".
